### Activity 1: Make Jessie & Friends puppets

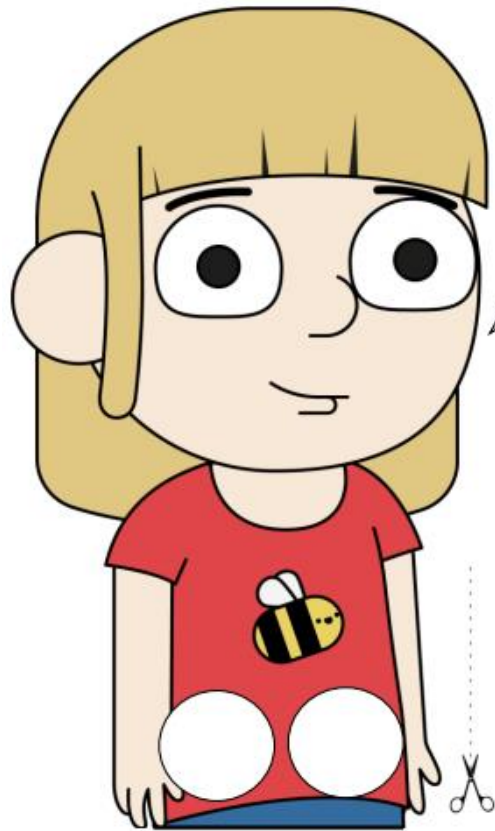

- If your child would like to they could perform the dance for others in their family, face-to-face or on video chat, with your support!

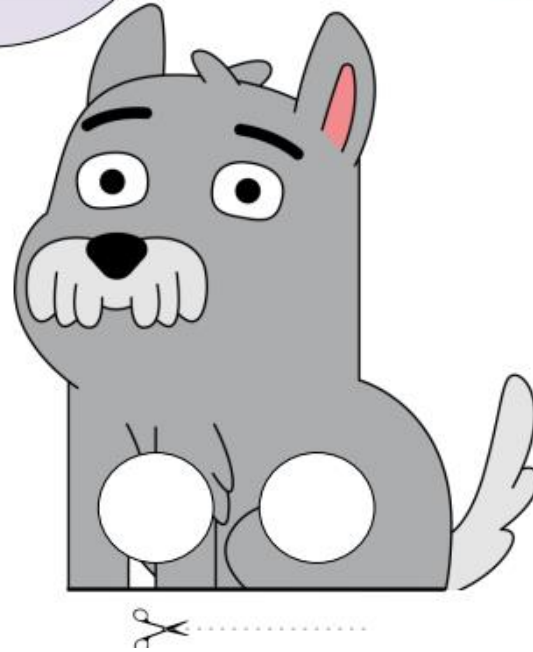


# Jessie and Friends Finger Puppets
