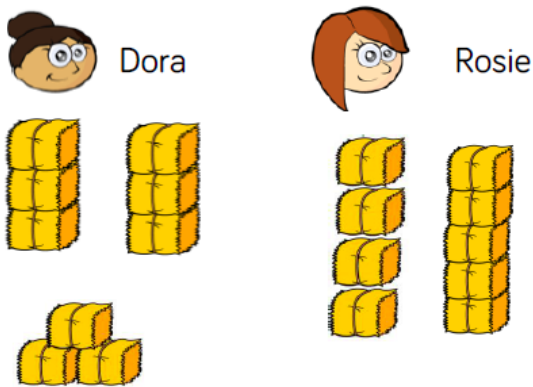

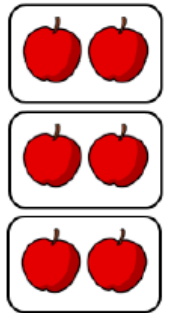

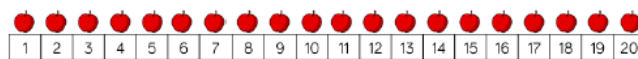

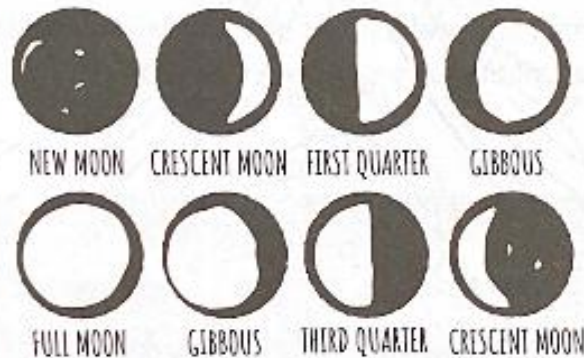

1. Refrigerate a packet of cookies
2. Twist off one side of each cookie. Hopefully all the filling will stay on one side.
3. Use a butter knife or similar tool to cut away the filling and create the moon shape. (To make it more fun - and messy - try biting the frosting off!)
4. Line up your cookies in the correct order
5. Keep in an air-tight container and treat yourself to a moon phase during Ramadan – yum!
