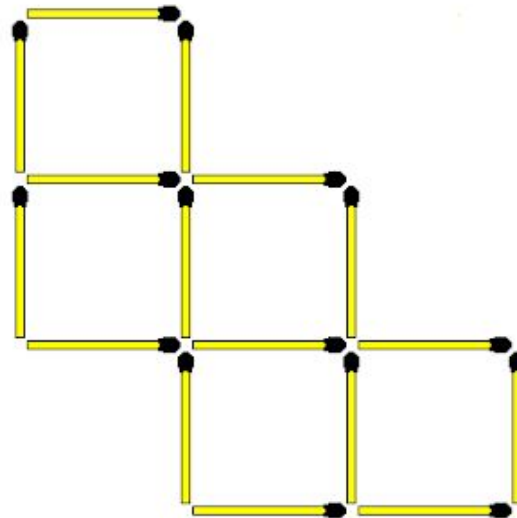
Good morning Year 6,



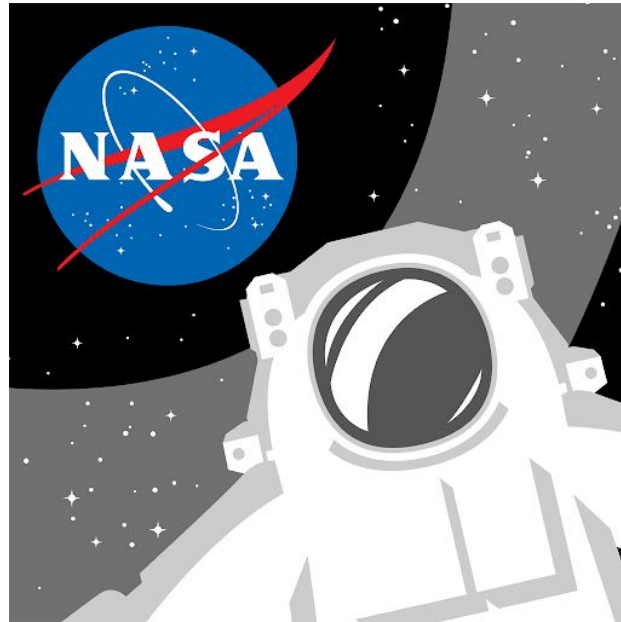
