If the above link does not work, go to <https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/> and login. Click 'Resources', 'Phase 3' and scroll down to the game 'Make a Match, Phase 3 (week 7)'.

Get children to point and say sounds on the sound sheet that was sent home. These are all of Phase 2 sounds and some of phase 3 (up to igh). You can also find these in the 'Phonics - Family Learning' document and as an attachment to the email sent.

Encourage children to read the phase 3 sentences.

A moth can be fat, but its wings are thin.	A ship hit the rocks with a thud.
Lots of shops sell chicken as well as fish and chips.	Josh had a shock as he got a bash on the chin.

Children can then practice writing the 'r' sound in pre-cursive writing: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=knhBaLebVq4>

Encourage children to make their own words in pre-cursive handwriting, which include the 'r' sound. For example: rag, red, far, from, rainbow. Have a go at saying and writing animal names starting with 'r' too.
