
The last week of Year 2! It has been such a pleasure to teach you all and we are so proud of you all! Cara and Zac are very lucky teachers to have you as their classes next year!





Now that we've read the whole story, do you think Tuffy changed over the story?




Do you think Tuffy will change in the future?

Remember to use the success criteria to help you to be successful in your writing.


Once you have finished, read through your writing with an adult or sibling and check for any spelling or punctuation mistakes. Do you think you could add anything in to make your writing even better?

Can you create your own illustrations to add to your Sunday diary entry?





What habitats will you find in your country?



You need to plan, design and make your countries using recycling from your home!
