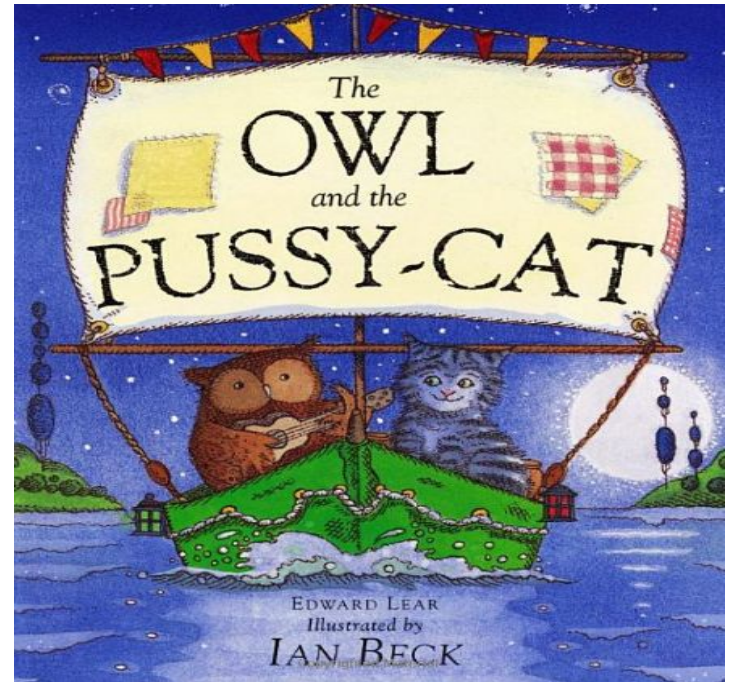
Happy Monday children!

Describe Owl and Pussy-Cat's journey throughout the year.

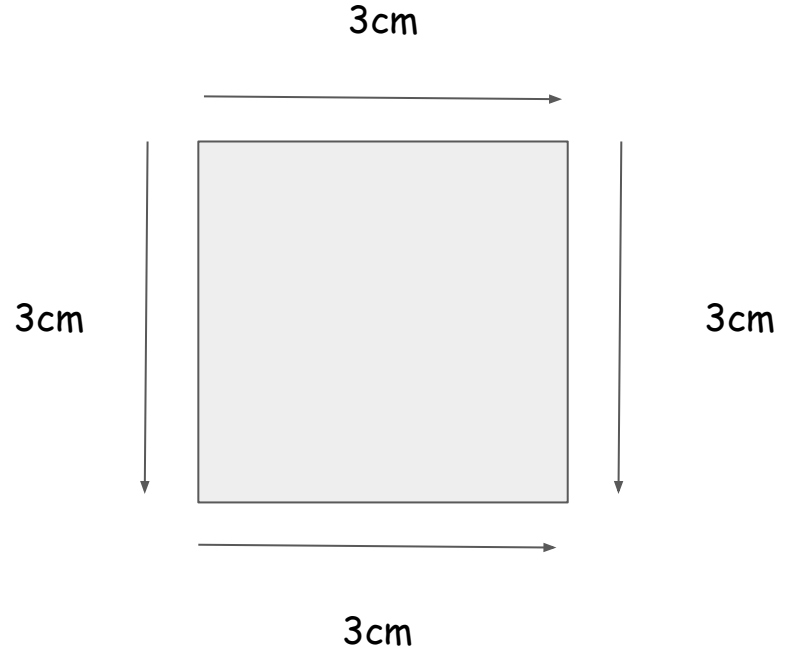


Maths

Today we're going to learn how measure accurately using centimetres (cm).

Steps to success:

I can draw a square
I can measure using a ruler
I can start at 0
I can draw a straight line with a ruler
I can say the perimeter of a shape



$$3\text{cm} + 3\text{cm} + 3\text{cm} + 3\text{cm} = 12\text{cm}$$

The perimeter is 12cm.

Draw a **rectangle** with sides measuring:

- e) 8cm, 1 cm
