- It needs to use time conjunctions.
- It needs to include exact dates, names and locations.
- It needs to be written in chronological order.
- It needs to include paragraphs.

Start with a paragraph about the very start of your life.

Read through the example below. Remember to use your timeline!

Next write a paragraph about school (starting school, your friends, school now, favourite lessons etc).

After I turned 4 years old, I began school. I was in blue class and made friends with Tom. We played on the climbing frame every day at lunch. It was our favourite thing to do. I loved art lessons at school and maths because I made up rhymes to remember all my times tables! My favourite year was year 5 as I got on well with my teacher Mr Day! He was so funny and told jokes all the time.
