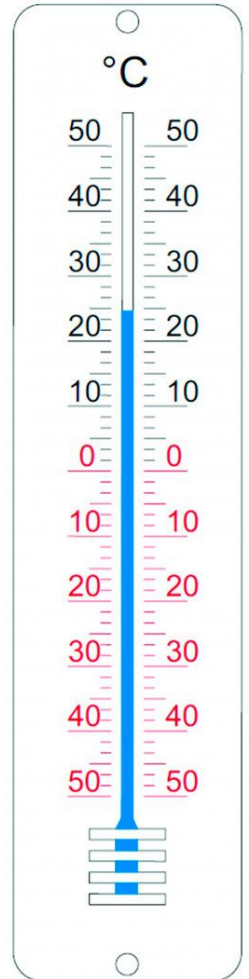
Maths
