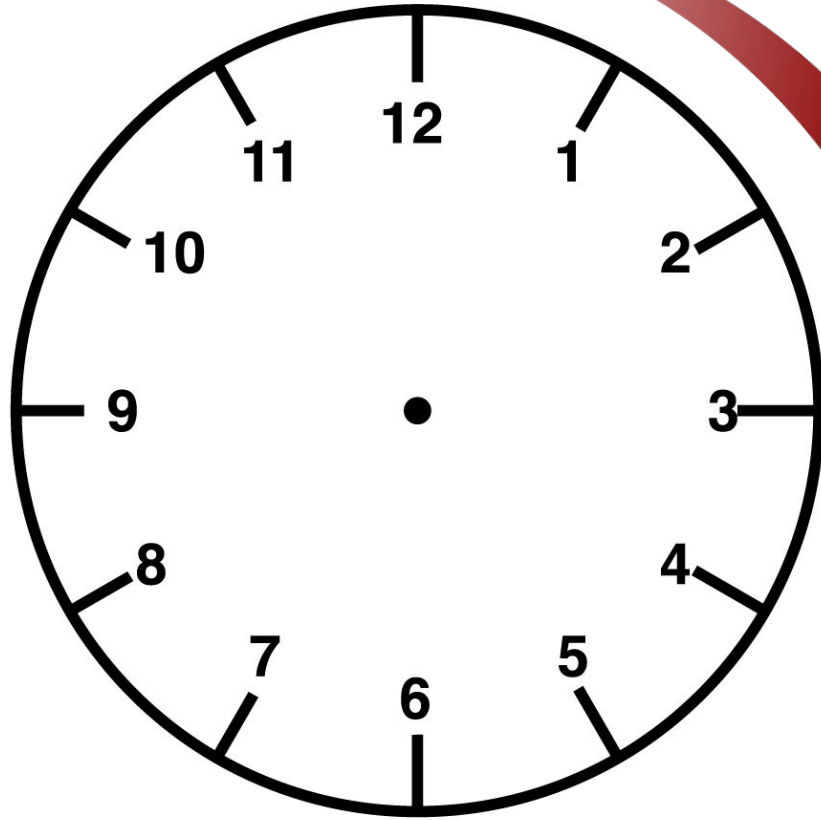

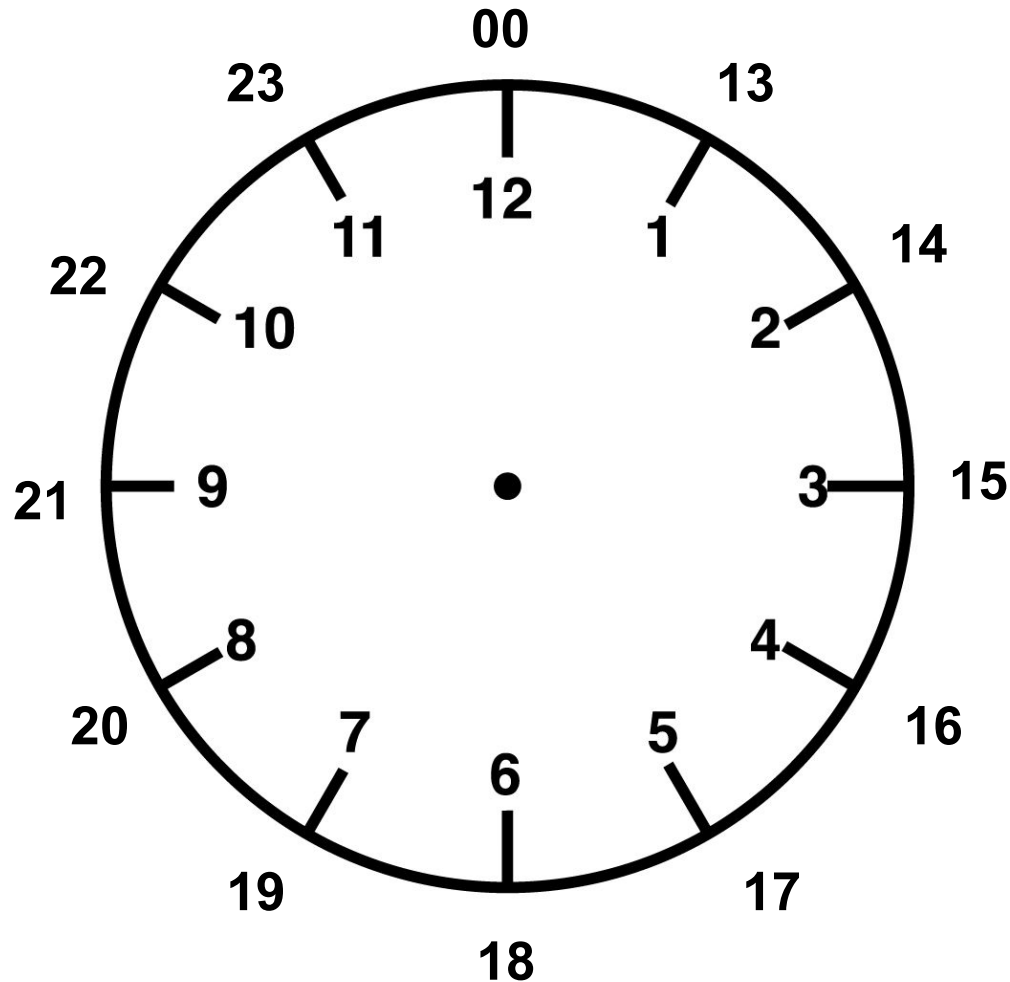
Today we are going to look at 24 hour time!

There are 24 hours in a day. It is split into two halves (12 hours each).

From midnight to 12 (midday) it is the morning. They are the first 12 hours of the day. We call this AM.

From 12 midday to 12 midnight it is the afternoon/evening. They are the second 12 hours of the day. We call this PM.

On an analogue clock face like this one, in 24 hours the hour hand moves around the clock twice.



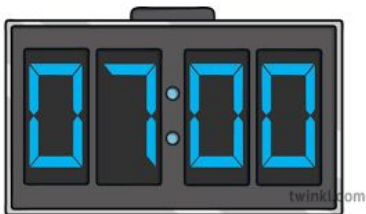
In the morning the hands on a clock move around the clock face once. So it could be one o'clock in the morning or eight o'clock in the morning. It takes 12 hours.

Once it reaches 12, it becomes the afternoon. Then the numbers are no longer 1, 2, 3... They become 13, 14, 15...
